HELEN KELLER – MOST IMPORTANT PERSON OF THE 20TH CENTURY? By Wayne Kasmar

Helen Keller (1880–1968) was well known during her lifetime, and she is still remembered as an inspirational human rights crusader and champion for the deaf and blind or for anyone suffering from limitations or handicaps. She was also a remarkable spiritual seeker who took great delight in sharing with others her joy for the spiritual reality of life. John Hitz was the person who brought Emanuel Swedenborg and his religious teachings to Helen's attention, giving her a copy of *Heaven and Hell* when she was fourteen. She writes:



When I began Heaven and Hell, I was as little aware of the new joy coming into my life as I had been years before when I stood on the piazza steps awaiting my teacher. . . . My heart gave a joyous bound. Here was a faith that emphasized what I felt so keenly—the separateness between soul and body, between the realm I could picture as a whole, and the chaos of fragmentary things and irrational contingencies that my limited senses met at every turn. I let myself go, as happy healthy youth will, and tried to puzzle out the long sentences and weighty words of the Swedish sage. . . . The words "Love" and "Wisdom" seemed to caress my fingers from paragraph to paragraph and these two words released in me new forces to stimulate my somewhat indolent nature and urge me forward evermore. . . . I was not "religious" in the sense of practicing ritual, but happy, because I saw God altogether lovely, after the shadows cast upon his image by the harsh creeds or warring sects and religions. The Word of God, freed from the blots and stains of barbarous creeds, has been at once the joy and good of my life.

While perusing a book in the local library recently I came across a largerscale and rather pleasant photo of Helen Keller, and knowing her enthusiasm for Swedenborg and his writings, I took the time to read the accompanying text. Here I was surprised to learn that in 1991 TIME magazine announced that she was the 20th Century's Most Important Person.

This caused me to be confused as I knew at the turn of this century TIME had announced Albert Einstein as its selection as Person of the 20th Century. Were there here two different categories of Person of the Century that TIME awarded? I know that the magazine had a tradition of annually announcing a Person of the Year (or Man of the Year in more sexist times.) This award was always a little strange as it was given to whoever had had the greatest impact on events during the year, whether for good or bad. So, on his basis it won't surprise you that even Adolf Hitler has been a TIME's Man of the Year.

So, might Albert Einstein, being TIME's Person of the 20th Century, be assessed number one in this category on this same basis? While separately the magazine might consider Helen Keller to be the 20th Century's Most Important Person – someone who has a deeper and ultimately longer lasting effect on the world? Certainly, Einstein's legacy to the world is not straightforward. While he obviously did a great deal of good through his scientific breakthroughs, one wonders what a survivor of the Hiroshima or Nagasaki atomic bombings thought of his being 'awarded' the title of Person of the 20th Century. Of course, Einstein wasn't responsible for creating the atomic bomb, but it has certainly complicated his legacy - something our bombing survivor may note with irony.

But Helen Keller's legacy was quite different. The library book explained that before she gained a public profile, people looked upon the 'handicapped' with fear and pity and felt they were best dealt with



by hiding them away in what were often inhumane institutions. Those with disabilities were considered 'defective,' and automatically the deaf were thought of as stupid (the two commonly used meanings of the word 'dumb' still reflect that.) People were astounded when this young blind and deaf woman started to conduct public lectures and spread a message of hope and optimism. Singlehandedly she changed society's way of viewing people with disabilities.

So, when TIME made her the 20th Century's Most Important Person, was the magazine judging the weighty depth of her influence, and endorsing the idea that it is the health of spirit that is ultimately the important thing in human life?

Trying to find out more about the 1991 announcement by TIME regarding Helen Keller, I went online and found ... nothing! The only reference online to TIME magazine and any sort of Person of the 20th Century type announcement was the widely publicized one about Einstein that I had remembered from 20 years ago. He was top of a list of 100 people that TIME put together to help come to their decision.

So, somewhat remarkably, the author of the library book seems to have simply got it wrong. Helen Keller was one of the 100 worthies that TIME listed and perhaps that is all the author meant to state in the book but somehow he got his wires crossed. But, then again, where did he get the idea that TIME made the announcement about her back in 1991. That seems so premature in any case given the century still had another decade to run at that point.

I came to the conclusion that the author's research was pretty diabolical when elsewhere in the book he provides commentary about the famous photo, also reproduced there, of US Marines raising the American flag on the Japanese island of Iwo Jima during World War Two. Here he informs us that this event occurred in Indonesia. He was out by about two thousand kilometres.

I must admit, it was a disappointment to find that Helen Keller

20th was not the Century's Most Important Person after all. It would have been a real feather in the cap of Swedenborg if she had. To have had the Person of the Centurv state, 'Swedenborg's message has been my stronaest incitement to overcome limitations,' as Helen Keller did, would have been an excellent thing to use in drumming up interest in him and is writinas.

In fact, thinking about his effect on her and others who did similar advocacy work in other areas, I wonder if we shouldn't be calling Swedenborg Mr. Enlightenment. Through his writings he really did influence many people to make the world a fairer, better place. As soon as the modern age started to emerge strongly in the 19th century, advocacy for obviously downtrodden groups started to arise. Racial discrimination, discrimination against women and harsh treatment of children were the three areas where challenges emerged. And in all three areas people influenced by Swedenborg were at the forefront of the battle.

In all three areas there were many who made significant contributions to the eventual victory. When it came to the fight for better treatment for people with disabilities, however, there was pretty much the one person in the beginning -Helen Keller. Her achievement, it could be argued, is pretty much unmatched in the way she single-handedly transformed people's attitude to those who were dealt very poor hands by life. The importance of this change society cannot in be overstated. Without it we could never have claimed to be truly human. Perhaps TIME should have decided on Helen Keller as the 20th Century's Most Important Person after all. It would have been a decision that really wouldn't have been too hard to defend.

Inner well-being – Can I rely on myself? By Stephen Russell-Lacy

We all probably want happiness and inner well-being. Yet sometimes we lack uplifting thoughts, forget the meaning and purpose which gave our life a sense of direction, or feel discouraged and stressed when facing adversity.

Is it really so difficult creating inner well-being for ourselves?

In times of hardship, we each need all

the comfort, and encouragement we can get from family members. The boss may give us time off to recover. Our friends may put us up where they live for a while. But can others make us happy, deeply happy? Therapists know that despite their therapeutic skill, there are always some clients who don't improve. They also realise they cannot take all the credit for those who do get better by pursuing personal change. You can lead a horse to water, but you can't make it drink. Unless people take responsibility for their own lives, nothing much changes whatever expertise is provided.

Reliance on one's own efforts alone for inner well-being

Many have wondered about ever finding inner well-being when going through an awful personal crisis, or when feeling apathetic and alienated from work. If they have tried to conjure up hope, confidence and contentment even with help from others, they probably have encountered great difficulty. My own experience has been that I sometimes lack inspiration and a sense of strength to pursue what I guess is the right direction – one that I value and find meaningful. I've come to accept I have freedom and thus responsibility to try to do something about my life. But that I can't achieve this by myself alone. I can

point myself in the right direction but can't create tolerance and generosity in myself just by having the right intentions. The soul needs nurturing.

Transpersonal energy creating inner well-being

I would suggest in addition to our own sensations and desires, personal growth comes from a greater light and energy. A higher power that give us inner well-being to manage the hurdles life placed in our path and to resist our personal demons. This idea of a higher power, however it is conceived, is also the view of the various 12 Step Recovery Programs available for various kinds of personal problems e.g. Alcoholics Anonymous.

These group interventions share the view that there is a spiritual source from beyond ourselves that can provide an inflow of healing power. In his best seller The Road Less Travelled, psychiatrist Scott Peck points out that natural growth and healing, mystical experiences, and fortunate coincidences, are commonplace. He says they are manifestations of a powerful force originating outside of human consciousness which nurtures the spiritual growth of human beings. He calls it Grace. This is a force other than, and in addition to, our conscious will. He identifies it with the power of love. The desire to nurture the inner well-being of people.



Swedenborg's experience

Emanuel Swedenborg was a Christian

mystic and spiritual philosopher who was born in the 17th century. Once he had a vision of a shinina presence. He said a brilliant light appeared to him in a similar way to how the sun appears to all of us. one Only which radiated spiritual heat and light. Light symbolising the wisdom that



enlightens our thought: heat, the feeling of compassion that gives warmth to our concerns. He said that this spiritual sun, normally invisible to us, is the origin of all that is good and true in life and thus our inner well-being. The physical sun in our sky is the basis of our geography and time. Similarly, for him, the visionary sun was the basis of all personal direction and orientation.

In line with this mystical experience, Swedenborg comments on the biblical creation narrative - not he said to be taken literally but an account of the potential creation of spiritual development in each person. On the 4th day of the creation myth, the sun, together with the moon and stars formed. Symbolically speaking, receiving the sun's light enlightens our understanding of higher principles: receiving its warmth stirs in us a concern for others. The picture here is an individual newly recognising that there is a higher source of deeper thought and kindness that comes from beyond oneself. Swedenborg maintains that this acknowledgment is critical. For without it, we each will depend only on ourself to find inner well-being. And this will lead to disappointment, pride and a sense of something lacking.

Conclusion about inner well-being

Swedenborg was writing during the Christian era in Europe. These days there are many who no longer believe in a personal God. I suspect that amongst non-religious people, there are nevertheless many who do believe in a universal spiritual source of everything. In other words, they acknowledge a Divinity that is both beyond, as well as potentially within, the individual. One that inspires, and is the origin of, compassion for others as well as for our own inner welfare. Also, the starting place of common sense to know what are useful and effective ways to act.

Whatever our troubles, I would suggest inner well-being is possible if we can learn how to connect with this divine creative spirit. And keep connecting. It can be seen as the kind of love that is a real thing in itself flowing into us from beyond ourselves. An infinite and everlasting reality originating beyond our own limitations.

This seems to tell us about how truth is to take us into the goodness and use of life, where we interact, provide, carry and sustain life, people being with people. There is nothing more poignant than a dry riverbed which, although it has been made, is serving no purpose. But a week of rain can change all that.

One effect, of there having been good rain is in the greening up of all the plant life around us, from the trees to the ferns, mosses, and the grass. This is intensely visual, as is the stunted brown of a drought. So, rain means resurgent life and growth and green wellness. All the more oxygen to do us good! Nature's health is the picture of our personal health in mind, spirit and body as we show gratitude, care, respect, and we discover the goodness and the wellbeing of it all. May it always rain within us as well as regularly around us.

and that wonderful correspondence of falling down onto the earth by coming from up above. God's regular reminder of his majesty and his healing. It is heavenly!

Rain works like a huge watering can. It comes diffusely and falls in raindrops rather than in torrents. This tells us that God's gift of rain is benevolent and shared with us all; the rain falls on the just and the unjust, wanting to bring growth and new life. The rain itself is water, and water corresponds to what is true. The truth that we see is there to bring growth and new life to us.

Sudden heavy rain usually runs off the ground it falls onto, especially if it is hard and dry. This seems to correspond to our unwillingness or our inability to listen to the truth when it comes. It goes to waste. Gentle rain and showers work more effectively. They may run off a bit, but they begin to open up the surface as the hard soil begins to receive the moisture of the rain and softens up. As it softens, the rain can begin to penetrate in the
