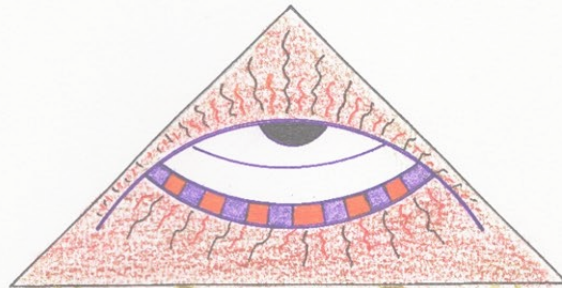


Written on the Heart
